Current evolutions

- Paradigm: "parents" should have or have had a romantic relationship with each other in order
 - to found a family
 - to have their family lift with the child protected

There should be no absolute rule


that a child's parents are, or have been, in a romantic relationship with each other

Current Law

Filiation by Blood: "pater is est..." etc

Filiation by Assisted Reproduction: (singles or) couples – exception Belgium

Adoption: by or within couples only

Parental Responsibilities: step-parents and social parents – exception Belgium
